

ORDINANCE: 12-12

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE VILLAGE ADMINISTRATOR, OR HIS DESIGNEE, TO ADVERTISE FOR BIDS THE REPAVING OF CERTAIN STREETS WITHIN THE VILLAGE AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, the Village of Thornville has determined paving certain streets within the Village is priority this year; and

WHEREAS, the Village of Thornville recently applied for, and received money from, the Ohio Public Works Commission, Small Government Commission to assist funding this street improvement project; and

WHEREAS, because Council for the Village of Thornville anticipates this paving project will cost more than \$25,000.00, R.C. 731.141 requires Council to authorize and direct this expenditure by Ordinance; and

WHEREAS, because Council for the Village of Thornville anticipates this paving project will cost more than \$25,000.00, R.C. 731.141 also requires the contract shall made with the lowest and best bidder after advertisement for not less than two nor more than four consecutive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation within the Village or as provided in R.C. 7.16.

NOW, **THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the Council of the Village of Thornville, County of Perry, State of Ohio:

SECTION 1: Council for the Village of Thornville hereby authorizes and directs the Village Administrator, or his designee, to advertise for bids for work on Village streets designated in Exhibit A attached hereto and made a part hereof, in the Village of Thornville, Thorn Township, for not less than two nor more than four consecutive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation within the Village or as provided in R.C. 7.16. The bids shall be opened and publicly read by the Village Administrator, or his designee, at the time, date, and place as specified in the advertisement to bidders or specifications.

SECTION 2: It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that any and all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements of the laws of the State of Ohio.


SECTION 3: All prior legislation, or any parts thereof, which is/are inconsistent with this Ordinance is/are hereby repealed as to the inconsistent parts thereof.

SECTION 4: Council declares this to be an emergency measure immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety of this municipality and the further reason that the Village needs to bid, award, and begin this paving project as soon as possible. Wherefore, provided this Ordinance receives the required affirmative votes of Council, it shall take effect and be in full force immediately upon passage by Council.


