

ORDINANCE NO. 26-07

ADOPTED ON: 7-6-2026

AN ORDINANCE REVOKING PERMISSION TO DISPOSE OF YARD WASTE ON PROPERTY OWNED BY THE VILLAGE OF THORNVILLE

WHEREAS, the Village of Thornville owns and operates a public works facility located at 100 Thompson Dr., Thornville, Ohio 43076. The Village utilizes this facility, among other purposes, to dispose of large debris; and

WHEREAS, the Village of Thornville currently permits its residents to dispose of brush trimmings, leaves, grass clippings, and other similar yard waste at this facility for convenience; and

WHEREAS, Council for the Village of Thornville has been made aware of issues where excess amounts of yard waste is being dumped at this facility. Such waste has become unsightly and difficult for the Village's public works departments to process; and

WHEREAS, Council for the Village of Thornville now wants to formally revoke permission and prohibit further disposal of unwanted excess yard waste at this public works facility.

NOW, **THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the Council of the Village of Thornville, County of Perry, State of Ohio:

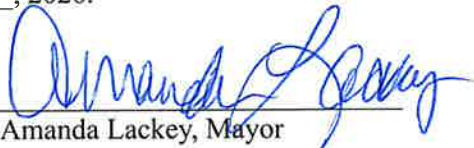
SECTION 1: Council for the Village of Thornville hereby revokes all permission for Village residents to dispose of yard waste at the public works facility located at 100 Thompson Dr., Thornville, Ohio 43076.

SECTION 2: Disposal of yard waste at this facility, including but not limited to brush trimmings, leaves, and grass clippings, shall henceforth be considered illegal dumping of refuse on municipally owned property in violation of Ohio Basic Code §93.25, as adopted and enforced by the Village of Thornville.

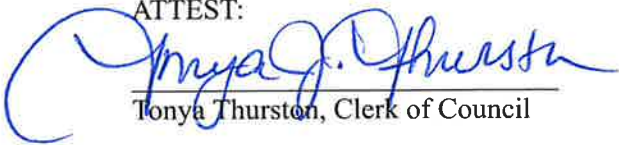
SECTION 3: It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements of the laws of the State of Ohio.

SECTION 4: This Ordinance shall take affect at the earliest time allowed by law,
