

ORDINANCE No. 14-05

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND ORDINANCE 13-15, THE 2014 ANNUAL APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE, REVISING SUMS FOR OPERATING EXPENSES AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, the Village of Thornville is authorized to adopt a municipal budget for the fiscal year beginning January 1, 2014 and ending December 31, 2014; and

WHEREAS, with Ordinance 13-15, adopted November 12, 2013, Council for the Village of Thornville established the Village's annual appropriations for the fiscal year ending December 31, 2014; and

WHEREAS, the Fiscal Officer has recommended amending the appropriations to supplement those appropriations previously adopted by Council.

NOW, **THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the Council of the Village of Thornville, County of Perry, State of Ohio:

SECTION 1: The 2014 Annual Appropriations of the Village of Thornville, as established by Ordinance 13-15, shall hereby be amended and additional amounts shall be appropriated, as recommended by the Fiscal Officer, as follows:

SECTION 2: All other original and amended sections and sub- section of Ordinance 13-15 shall remain unchanged, in effect, and enforceable.

SECTION 3: It is hereby found and determined that all formal action of this Council concerning and relating to the Ordinance were adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in open meeting of this Council, and that any and all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements of the laws of the State of Ohio.

SECTION 4: All prior legislation, or any parts thereof, which is/are inconsistent with this Ordinance is/are hereby repealed as to the inconsistent parts thereof.

SECTION 5: Council declares this to be an emergency measure immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety of this municipality and the further reason that Council needs to provide the necessary funds to meet requirements and obligations. Wherefore, provided this Ordinance receives the required affirmative votes of Council, it shall take effect and be in full force immediately upon passage.
