

ORDINANCE NO. 15-10

AN ORDINANCE TO REVISE THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF THE VILLAGE OF THORNVILLE, OHIO BY ADOPTING CURRENT REPLACEMENT PAGES AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, various ordinances of a general and permanent nature have been passed by the Council for the Village of Thornville which must be included in the Codified Ordinances; and

WHEREAS, certain provisions within the Codified Ordinances of the Village of Thornville should be amended to conform with current State Law as required by the Ohio Constitution; and

WHEREAS, the Village of Thornville has heretofore entered into a contract with the Walter H. Drane Company to prepare and publish an annual supplement to the Codified Ordinances which is before Council.

NOW, **THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the Council of the Village of Thornville, County of Perry, State of Ohio:

SECTION 1: The ordinances of the Village of Thornville, Ohio, of a general and permanent nature, as revised, recodifies, rearrange, and consolidated into component codes, titles, chapters and sections within the 2015 Replacement Pages to the Codified Ordinances are hereby approved and adopted.

SECTION 3: The complete text of the sections listed above is set forth in full in the current replacement pages to the Codification Ordinance which are hereby attached to this Ordinance as Exhibit A and incorporated herein by reference. Notice of adoption of each new section by reference to its title shall constitute sufficient publication of new matter contained herein.

SECTION 4: It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that any and all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements of the laws of the State of Ohio.


SECTION 5: This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, welfare and safety and for the further reason that there exists an imperative necessity for the earliest publication and distribution of current replacement pages to the officials and residents of the Village, so as to facilitate administration, daily operation and avoid practical and legal entanglements. Wherefore, provided this Ordinance receives the required affirmative votes of Council, it shall take effect and be in full force immediately upon passage.
