

ORDINANCE NO. 25-11

ADOPTED ON: 4-14-2025

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 1 OF ORDINANCE 25-05 AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, with Ordinance 25-05, adopted on February 24, 2025, Council for the Village of Thornville reverted \$161,878.15 from the Pool Fund back to the Letherman Fund to be used to purchase, maintain, and/or improve Recreational Community Facilities within the Village; and

WHEREAS, since adopting Ordinance 25-05, Council for the Village of Thornville learned the amount reverted from the Pool Fund was incorrect; and

WHEREAS, since adopting Ordinance 25-05, the Fiscal Officer determined that an additional \$20,058.83 of interest from the Letherman fund also was transferred incorrectly to the Pool Fund; and

WHEREAS, a complete accounting of transactions in the Pool Fund have been reviewed, and \$3,205.70 in expenditures have been confirmed to be valid Pool Fund transactions; and

WHEREFORE, Council for the Village of Thornville now wants to amend Section 1 of Ordinance 25-05 and identify the correct fund balance that is being reverted.

NOW, **THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the Council of the Village of Thornville, County of Perry, State of Ohio:

SECTION 1: Section 1 of Ordinance 25-05, adopted on February 24, 2025 shall be amended to read as follows:

Council for the Village of Thornville hereby reverts \$178,753.78 from the Pool Fund (5501) back to the Letherman Fund (2903) to be used to purchase, maintain, and/or improve Recreational Community Facilities within the Village.

SECTION 2: All prior legislation, or any parts thereof, which is/are inconsistent with this Ordinance is/are hereby repealed as to the inconsistent parts thereof.

SECTION 3: It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements of the laws of the State of Ohio.

SECTION 4: Council declares this to be an emergency measure immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety of the Village and the further reason that Council needs to correct this reversion immediately. Wherefore, provided this Ordinance receives the required affirmative votes of Council, this Ordinance shall take effect and be in force immediately upon passage by Council.
